For instance, Cornell has not been able to draw down Federal grant funds since April but has allowed researchers that have negotiated grants and contracts with Federal agencies to continue to make expenditures, using non-federal funding sources. The sum for the largesse? \$90 million. If ever there was a clarion for us to collaborate and support each other, it's now.
