Farm Bill

- Hearing underway
 - PBD Chair Jay Akridge testified at House Ag in March
 - More Ag research hearings coming up
- "On-Time"
- Tension already brewing (ie Dairy vs. Cotton)



Budget and Appropriations

- FY 2018 Appropriations process has begun
 subcommittees are writing bills
- <u>APLU PRIORITY:</u> Increase NIFA by \$200 million in APLU's six priority lines
- President's FY 2018 Budget Request was a doozy - ~22% cut to USDA; ~8% cut to NIFA

Advocacy

- Stay engaged with your congressional delegation YEAR ROUND
- Advocacy ≠ one meeting per year
- Advocacy =
 - Being a resource without being a bug
 - Meetings back at home in the district/state
 - Tours of facilities in the district/state
 - Attend/Sponsor fundraisers



Strong Stalks

- Provide a PERSONALIZED and RELEVENT message to Congress
- Identify individuals (CARET) that are stakeholders of the institution and have adequate relationships with decision makers



Mobilization

- When you see a Call to Action from Cornerstone/BAC/CLP – ANSWER THE CALL
- Follow up and follow through



One Voice

- Ag research community consistently shoots each other and ourselves in the foot
- The NIH model is classic, but need to make it work for agriculture
