### Action items:

Private ag industries R&D funding now exceeds public investment in ag R&D. The updating on investment by foreign countries in ag R&D is currently paused. We have also posted a paper by Phil Pardey on "<u>Revitalizing the Slow Magic of US Agri-Food Research</u>", a paper published in 2023.
