Reminders/Updates:

- At the beginning of August, the USDA opened a 30-day public comment period in response to the Department's reorganization plan. (Late in August, the 30-day comment period was extended through September 30, 2025.) The Executive Committee recommended submission of comments from the region. We drafted comments based on a template from the North Central region and the Budget and Legislative Committee and shared a Northeast perspective. The Letter is posted on our website under the Workroom>agInnovation Northeast Key Correspondence pulldown menu (see Letter on Reorganization to Secretary Brooke Rollins from agInnovation Northeast, August 31, 2025).
- Again: We hear you! Several directors asked for our monthly call to be moved (it conflicted with NEED's standing call). Our next scheduled Zoom calls will be held at 8:00 AM on October 16, November 20, and December 18. Agendas and connection details will be sent to you prior to the meeting.
- Again: The <u>2025 Northeast Management Officers (NEMO)</u>
 <u>Conference</u> will be held from October 20-22, 2025, in Ithaca, NY at the Ithaca Downtown Conference Center. You can register, book your room, and download the agenda on the conference website. Registration closes on Friday, 9/19.

Informational items:

- The National Academies has released a report entitled <u>Fulfilling</u> <u>the Public Mission of the Land Grant System: Building Platforms for Collaboration and Impact</u>. The report explores the structures and platforms necessary to support sustainable collaboration with partners inside and outside the Land-Grant system. This release is a follow-up to the virtual meeting held by the National Academies on June 12-13.
