• The minutes from the agInnovation Northeast business meeting held on September 17, 2025, have been posted on the 2025 agInnovation.Northeast Fall Meeting webpage. There are two items in the minutes that we call out. First, there's a link embedded in the minutes to Jason Hubbart's presentation "A Computational Pivot". The other item in the minutes revolves around the delay in the release of an RFA. To reiterate the message that we shared with the directors last week, the Request for Applications for the capacity funds is expected around October 1. Alternatively, the Request for Applications for the Research Facilities Act is not

expected until after January 1, 2026.

- agInnovation Northeast underwent its annual turnover in leadership during our business meeting in St. Louis. Jason Hubbart is now Chair, Eric von Wettberg is Vice Chair, and Chris Smart is the Officer-at-large. Many thanks to Wendie Cohick who chaired the Association during the past year! With Wendie's change in roles, we now have an opening on agInnovation's Budget and Legislative Committee (BLC). Are any of you interested in serving on the BLC? If so, please contact Rick and David.
- The minutes and slide deck from the agInnovation Business Meeting on September 18 are now posted. Check those out.

- Second time: At the beginning of August, the USDA opened a 30-day public comment period in response to the Department's reorganization plan. (Late in August, the thirty-day comment period was extended through September 30, 2025.) The Executive

Committee recommended submission of comments from the region. We drafted comments based on a template from the North Central region and the Budget and Legislative Committee and shared a Northeast perspective.
